- 1. Do I have permission to share the contents of this interview?
- 2. Do you have any questions before we begin?
- 3. What interests you about your family tree/ancestry?
- 4. Is there anyone, in particular, you're interested in learning about?
- 5. Have you ever tried to trace your family history? If so, what has your experience been?
- 6. Have your parents, family, etc. ever been interested in ancestry/genealogy?
- 7. What sort of things do you remember being important to your parents as you were growing up?
- 8. Tell me a little bit about your family's background. Is there anything that might be important to note for future generations? (medical, religious, geographical, etc.)
- 9. What do you know about your family surname?
- 10. How close were you to your mother's side of the family growing up?
- 11. How close were you to your father's side of the family growing up?
- 12. Growing up, did you spend a lot of time with extended family
- 13. Was/is there a specific family member you had/have a particularly close relationship with?

- 14. Do you have any items that you would like to share with us? Family bibles, diary entries, etc.?
- 15. Do you have any memorable family stories (e.g. stories that have been passed down)?
- 16. What was your childhood home and community like?
- 17. Did you live in the same place for most of your life, or did you move around?
- 18. What traditions can you remember being passed down in your family?
- 19. Can you tell us about some of the most impactful events that happened during your childhood? How do you think they affected you, your family, and your community?
